As we consider purpose for reading, it is important to keep in mind the importance of both instructional and recreational reading. Learning to read is a life-long process. Both instructional and recreational reading play an important role in this process through the development of literacy skills.

Instructional & Recreational Reading

Instructional reading helps students make sense of written language through reading that includes a curricular component such as examining text structures. Through teacher

supported instructional reading, students cultivate reading skills and print concepts such as phonemic awareness, vocabulary development, and comprehension.

Recreational reading is the reading of any book (in any format) chosen by the student that is not connected to a follow-up exercise

such as comprehension questions or summary. This free voluntary reading practice nurtures the student's relationship with reading while

increasing literacy and developing vocabulary. Reading for pleasure has an enormous effect on his or her attitude, motivation, and selfesteem toward

reading. To grow lifelong learners who have a love of reading, it is important to have a balance between instructional and recreational reading.
