The South Dakota State Library provides access to free resources, services, and consultations to all tribal and school libraries.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Library Methods Courses

- <u>ExCITE! Library Methods</u>: An annual online professional development opportunity (2 credit course) held annually in July for school librarians and other school professionals. LSTA federal funding through the Institute of Museum and Library Services provides full-tuition scholarships for participants.
- <u>ExCITE! Reboot Course</u>: An annual online winter course that repurposes the content from the summer library methods course. Tuition is paid for by the participant.
- <u>Library Methods On-Demand Courses</u>: Self-paced, on-demand library methods courses on a variety of topics that can be taken for CEUs.

SD Public Library Institute

- A 4-year program for public librarians to earn a Certificate of Public Library Management
- Held annually (in-person in June and then online)
- Free college tuition; may use IMLS Native American Basic Grant funds to cover travel expenses
- Four modules of study: Children's Services, Teen Services, Reference and Research Services, and Administration and Management of a Library

- <u>SDSL's Collect + Connect Meet-ups</u> are monthly Zoom chat opportunities for librarians across the state.

- Academic Library Collect + Connect: 3rd Thursday at 12:00pm CT

Jump Start Workshop

- Prep for Summer Reading Program
- All educators, library personnel, and local volunteers are welcome to participate
- Free regional one-day workshops (in-person and virtual) held every February and March
- CSLP (Cooperative Summer Library Program) national memberships to all state recognized libraries including five tribal academic libraries
- Free summer reading manuals/materials to those who attend
