- 5. **Do the Heavy Lifting:** Take on the research, resource curation, and tech integration to make collaboration seamless.

- Administrators: Show them the value of librarian-teacher partnerships and get their support.
- **Tech-Savvy Innovators:** Partnering with teachers who embrace technology can lead to exciting collaborations that showcase the library's impact.

What to Collaborate On

- **Complex Concepts:** Provide support for topics that require deeper exploration or multiple perspectives.
- Topics Teachers Feel Less Confident Teaching: Offer resources and co-teach to fill in knowledge gaps.
- Activities That Require More Support: Design and facilitate hands-on learning experiences.

Easy Ways to Get Started

- Work with Classes on a Regular Schedule: Establish a rhythm of collaboration with teachers you already see frequently.
- **Campus PD Rotations:** Offer professional development sessions to showcase how the library can support instruction.
- Present at District or Area Events: Gain visibility and credibility as an instructional leader.
- Attend Trainings and Conferences: Find local and online events that provide networking and professional learning opportunities.
