Digital Literacy in the School Library

Digital literacy refers to the ability to use, understand, and critically evaluate information in various digital forms. It involves a range of skills that enable individuals to navigate the digital world effectively, engage with digital content, and use digital tools for communication, collaboration, and problem-solving. It is a key component of Civic and Ethical Literacy and is also a component of both Textual Literacy and Informational Literacy - the three strands of the <u>SD School Library Standards</u>.

Our school libraries are uniquely positioned to foster both traditional and digital literacies as we offer print resources and digital platforms for learning and research. The school librarian has the opportunity and responsibility to guide students in how to find reliable information, how to evaluate sources critically, how to practice ethical online behavior, and how to navigate digital spaces safely.

Here are some ideas for integrating Digital Literacy into your library instruction:

Online Tutorials and Guides:

Create online tutorials or guides that students can access independently or as part of classroom assignments. Cover topics like effective online searching, using online databases, and citing digital sources.

Collaborate with Teachers:

Work closely with teachers to embed digital literacy skills into the curriculum. Co-plan lessons that integrate technology and digital research skills, reinforcing what students are learning in their classrooms.

Interactive Learning Platforms:

Explore interactive learning platforms and educational apps that promote digital literacy. Integrate these tools into library activities to make learning more engaging and hands-on for students.

Digital Storytelling Projects:

Encourage students to create digital storytelling projects, incorporating multimedia elements. This not only develops digital literacy skills but also enhances creativity and communication skills.

Critical Evaluation of Online Sources:

Teach students how to critically evaluate online sources for credibility, bias, and relevance. Provide practical exercises where students compare information from different sources and discuss their findings.

Cybersecurity Awareness:

Introduce lessons on cybersecurity, teaching students about online privacy, the risks of sharing personal information, and strategies for staying safe online.

Online Research Skills:

Develop lessons on effective online research skills, including using advanced search techniques and navigating <u>academic databases</u>. Emphasize the importance of citing digital sources accurately.

Digital Citizenship Programs:

Implement a digital citizenship program that covers responsible and ethical online behavior. Emphasize the importance of respectful communication, avoiding plagiarism, and understanding the consequences of online actions.

Gamification of Learning:

Gamify digital literacy lessons by creating educational games or challenges. This approach can make learning more enjoyable and motivate students to actively participate in building their digital skills.

Tech Tools Exploration:

Introduce students to a variety of digital tools and platforms. Allow them to explore tools for creating presentations, conducting online surveys, or collaborating on projects, fostering a versatile skill set.

Continuous Professional Development:

Stay informed about the latest developments in technology and digital literacy. Attend <u>professional development opportunities</u> and share new insights with colleagues to ensure a collaborative approach to integrating digital literacy into the curriculum.
