PRACTICAL STRATEGIES

Tell the Story of Learning



Your library is a hub of learning, creativity, and connection. Make that story visible!

- Share small wins: Post quick photos or blurbs on your school's internal communication platform or newsletter. ("Fifth graders used library resources today to create digital timelines of the American Revolution!")
- Highlight student voice: Feature student book reviews, reading reflections, or displays that showcase what they're learning.
- Show the process: Capture not just final projects but the research, collaboration, and inquiry along the way.

Communicate with Intention



Your communication is part of your library's narrative.

- Make it visual: Use simple infographics or short, engaging slides to share circulation stats, collaboration highlights, or program participation.
- **Keep it brief:** Teachers and administrators appreciate concise updates that show impact.
- **Tell, don't sell:** Frame messages around student learning and outcomes instead of library needs or defenses.

Reflect and Record



Consistent reflection turns daily actions into long-term evidence! Consider keeping a simple impact log, collecting quotes and data and pictures, and reviewing what you collect regularly.

Strengthen Connections



Each collaboration reinforces the library as a teaching partner.

- Offer ready-to-go mini-lessons: Create quick plug-in lessons teachers can request, like evaluating sources or citing evidence.
- **Be proactive:** Drop a friendly note or short resource list in a teacher's mailbox that connects with an upcoming unit.
- **Celebrate teamwork:** When you co-teach, give public credit to both the library and the classroom.

Create Visibility



Influence starts with being seen.

- **Host quick hallway displays:** Feature student work or thematic book pairings outside the library.
- Open your doors: Invite staff to casual "Library Coffee Chats" to talk about resources or ideas.
- Celebrate milestones: National Library Week, Read Across America, and America250 are perfect opportunities to showcase your programs.

Build Gratitude/Partnership



Relationships are the heart of influence.

- Recognize support: Thank teachers who collaborate, custodians who help with displays, and administrators who visit your space.
- Involve others: Invite staff and students to help choose new books or name a new display.

New signage in nonfiction, themed book displays, and curated sections for readers at every level make the library easy to navigate and fun to explore.
