

Why do you use the Braille and Talking Book Library?




On average, how much time do you spend reading on a WEEKLY basis?


How do rate the overall quality of the Braille and Talking Book Library?


How often do you contact staff at the Braille & Talking Book program?


Ease of contacting us:




Staff returns telephone messages and emails in a timely manner:


When you contact the library, do you receive the assistance or material you requested?








Do you have access to a computer or other electronic device with internet access?


